NOTICE OF SEPA
DETERMINATION

The City of Kirkland has conducted an environmental review of the following project:

File No.: SEP02-00010
Proponent: Firwood Lane LLC
Address or Location of proposal: 93rd Lane NE at NE 124th Street
Description of project: Rockery reinforcement, removal of rock stream channel lining, selective removal of non-native plant species and native revegetation, and reconfiguration and enhancement of an existing stream.

Notice is hereby given that on July 2, 2002 the City of Kirkland issued a Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) in accordance with the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) and Chapter 197-11 of the Washington Administrative Code.

The proposal has been changed to include the following measures (summarized) to mitigate impacts: All work shall conform to the Detailed Stream Enhancement Plan (DSEP). No machinery shall be utilized within the stream bed, except as described in the DSEP. The stream bank and buffer shall be restored during the in-water work period approved by the Wash. DFW (typically 6/15-9/15). An ongoing invasive species management plan shall be incorporated into the landscaping maintenance plan. Temporary construction fencing shall be installed around all work areas, and shall remain for the duration of work. A Natural Greenbelt Protection Easement shall be provided to the City. Permanent protective fencing shall be placed between the mobile homes and the stream. Educational signs shall be installed. All minor improvements west of the permanent fencing shall be removed as tenants vacate the associated mobile homes. The fence at the north property line may remain.

Procedures to Appeal: You may contact Nancy Cox at (425) 828-1253 to ask about the procedures for SEPA appeals:

1. A written appeal must be filed with the Environmental Coordinator, Nancy Cox, by 5 PM on July 16, 2002 at the above address.
2. The appeal must contain a brief and concise statement of the matter being appealed, the specific components or aspects that are being appealed, the appellant's basic rationale or contentions on appeal, and a statement demonstrating standing to appeal. The following have standing to appeal: 1) the applicant; 2) any agency with jurisdiction; 3) any individual or other entity who is specifically and directly affected by the proposed action. The appeal may also contain whatever supplemental information the appellant wishes to include.
3. Pay the \$150.00 fee to file an appeal.

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
